
Follow These Easy Steps to Vote by Mail

Step 1: Watch for your absentee ballot application to arrive in the mail in late May or early June from your city/township or county clerk, or from the Secretary of State.

Step 2: Fill out and sign the application using your official signature. **Check the box for both the August and November elections.**

If you're not already on the permanent absentee voter list, check the box that says "I want to vote absentee in all future elections." That way, you'll automatically get an absentee ballot application in the mail before *every* election.



Step 3: Return the application as soon as possible to your city/township clerk in one of these ways:

- Take a photo of the application and email it to your local clerk.
- Mail the application to your local clerk.
- <u>Drop off</u> the application at your local clerk's office. Call first to make sure the clerk's office is open.

Step 4: Keep an eye out for your absentee ballot to arrive in the mail. Your August primary ballot should arrive around June 25, and your November ballot should arrive around September 24. You can track your application and ballot online at the **Michigan Voter Information Center** michigan.gov/vote.

Step 5: Vote your ballot from the comfort of your home, place it in the envelope provided, and sign the outside of the envelope using your official signature.

Step 6: Turn in your ballot. Your completed ballot must get to your city/township clerk by 8 pm on Election Day in order to count. To ensure your ballot arrives by the deadline:

- Drop it in the mail at least a week before Election Day.
- If it's less than a week before Election Day, drop it off at your city/township clerk's office.
